About the Institute

The St.Xavier's Institute of Education was established in the year 1953 with the vision of Joyous Creative Teacher Education. The College is affiliated to the University of Mumbai. Both, curricular and co-curricular activities organized in this year reflected the Vision and Mission of the college.

Annual Report 2017-18

St. Xavier's Institute of Education had specially planned curricular activities for the year 2017-18, in sync with the vision & mission statement and to achieve the objectives. Efforts have been taken at all levels to promote activities in this direction. The Management works in close coordination with the faculty to ensure a synergistic approach towards promoting and achieving the vision and mission of the institute.

For this academic year, the Institution has adopted the theme of 'Reflective Action through Harmony' as a foundation for implementing all the activities. The Institution carefully planned and implemented the curricular activities based on this theme and the core philosophy of our Institution, Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm (IPP). The Institution caters to the need of the students in various dimensions to achieve 'Reflective Action through Harmony'. Through the Two year B.Ed curriculum, institution got an array of opportunities to promote intellectual and reflective thinking of the students to lead them towards this direction.

Theme of the Year

The Institute adopts every year a theme as a pole star for guiding and promoting values above and beyond the present syllabus and activities set by the University of Mumbai. In 2014-15, the theme was Well-being and the College magazine has recorded the programs and activities promoting Well- being and its dimensions amongst the students.

In the year 2015-16 the institution was decided 'Harmony' as the theme for the year. In the planning year of 2016-17, it was planned that 2016-17 will be 'Experiential Induction into Harmony' and 2017-18 will be 'Reflective Action towards Harmony' in keeping with the Founder's Philosophy of Ignatian's Pedagogical Paradigm.

In 2018-19, the focus is promoting these activities, programs and skills to internship schools, community and making a comprehensive collection of the experiences and program into a compilation of book tentatively called Pedagogy of Harmony or Living with Harmony

Teaching learning process occurs based on the core principle of Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm. Based on the IPP, the teachers use an amalgamation of different learning strategies and methods interaction with students. This year, an initiative was taken for developing a platform for Learning Management System (LMS).

'Quality' is possible only when the community 'reflects or 'introspects' on the activity. This helped the faculty and student teachers to analyse the different stages involved in a task and to deeply analyse their involvement at every stage. Thus, the institute emphasized on 'Reflection' as the Core Activity'.

2. Core Philosophy of Course Transaction

Teaching learning process occurs based on the core principle of Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm. Based on the IPP, the teachers use an amalgamation of different learning strategies and methods in their interaction with students. The diverse learning needs of the students were catered to through the use of interactive teaching methods. Among the various teaching methods adopted include; group activities, team teaching, workshops, flipped classroom approach, reflective writing, case study, cooperative learning strategies, activity based and ICT based strategies.

This year, an initiative was taken for developing a platform for Learning Management System (LMS). The developing process is in the final stage and we hope that, the institution would implement Learning Management System in the next academic year for the teaching learning process. For enhancing the reference work, specific library time was also assigned in the timetable for the individual/ group work related to each course.

II. Curricular Activities

1. Course work

Assignments are a part of each course work. The college systematically planned and designed the course work. For conducting each assignment, specific time was provided in the timetable. During this time, the faculty in charge and the students discussed the tasks, and the faculty in charge provided guidelines to the students for conducting these course works successfully. During the submission of report, student teachers were asked to reflect on their experience with reference to the task, individually or in groups. This helped the students to correlate the theory with the actual educational context.

2. Extension

Community Service: Harmony with students from diverse

For realizing the need of the community, this year too, community service was arranged by the institution. Students went to community centres like YMCA at Andheri, Cheshire Disability Trust at Andheri and Shelter Don Bosco at Matunga for their program from 12th December to 16th community service December, 2017. During the community service, student teachers basically helped the students at the centre in their academic activities. The students have submitted a detailed report on the activities performed on each day, along with their reflection. Evaluation of community work was conducted with the involvement of staff members at every centre. Feedback was also obtained from the community centres. The reflections were presented in soul stirring assemblies which blended the attitude and sensitivity with the curriculum requirement.

II. Curricular Activities

1. Course work

The college systematically planned and designed the Course work. The faculty in charge provided guidelines to the students conducting this course successfully.

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For realizing the need of the community, this year too, community service was arranged by the institution. During the community service, student teachers were basically helping the students at the centre their academic activities. community service is an experiential learning through which student teachers can learn to appreciate the diverse context of the marginalized students. In the current academic year, the college has also organized the literacy awareness program in a non-formal setup in collaboration with REAP (Reach Education Action Programme).

3. Teacher Enrichment Add On Programme

The institute continues with its 60 hours Teacher Enrichment Add-on Program, offering courses to enhance their teacher competence. In the last few years the teacher enrichment programme has added to joyous, creative education of the student teachers. For this academic year, topics relevant to the theme 'Reflective Action towards Harmony' has broadened the perspectives of the student teachers. Through this course, it is hoped that student teachers would be exposed to a variety of socio cultural realities and would be able to hone certain teaching competencies. Experts from the field were invited and the expertise of the in-house teachers was also utilized.

4. Method Club Activities

Method club had organized a program/ field visit to different place/s of importance. Following places were visited by the students and faculty during the academic year 2016-17.

6. Faculty Exchange Program

Faculty exchange programs were continued with other colleges in the fraternity. The staff members of two institutes, collectively worked in teaching a unit before transaction in the colleges. In the current academic year, four faculty exchange programs were conducted by the college with Seva Sadan's College of Education, Ulhasnagar. The faculty exchange program gave new perspectives to the students about the topics. This also served as a measure for enhancing teacher quality at the institute.

7. School Internship

Students of the current academic year went for internship programs to different schools as per the requirement of University and NCTE. The internship programs were organized by the institution from July 2017 to October 2017 and from December 2017- February 2018. Totally, nine schools participated for the internship program and all the students successfully completed their internship program. The internship activities included activities like Shadowing of pedagogy teacher, Observation of peer lessons, Observation of school activities, Co teaching with teachers and peers, Action research and Organizing Co-Curricular Activities helped the student teachers to orient on various teaching methodology and understanding the school climate. A set of criteria/rubrics was developed by the institution to ensure objective evaluation for all the internship activities by the faculty members.

8. Movie

Learning in harmony with Media: An educational film was watched by the B.Ed. Students and faculty for critical and educational review. Students were guided by teachers of course papers Creating Inclusive Schools (S.Y B.Ed) and Learning and Teaching(F.Y B.Ed). Students were given guided questions and orientation of how to use educational film as a learning tool and resource.

III. Evaluation and Feedback Process

1. Internal Assessment Evaluation

The institute ensured that the evaluation process for all the activities of internal assessment were clarified to the students, well in advance. The students were informed about the Criteria for evaluation/Performance Indicators of different activities through the orientation. In case of examination,

The institute ensured that the evaluation process for all the activities of internal assessment were clarified to the students well in advance. In case of examination, general feedback was provided by each course teacher in the answer sheets distributed in the class along with their grade. Thus, students could understand the evaluation framework of their work by themselves which provided openness in the internal assessment evaluation.

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2. University Exam

In the current academic year, the first semester examination was conducted by the University of Mumbai in the month of January 2018 and Third Semester exam was conducted in the month of November 2017. The second and fourth semester exam will be tentatively planned by the University in the month of May 2018. 49 S.Y B.Ed students and 48 F.Y B.Ed students had written the University semester end examination. All the students successfully passed in the First semester and Third semester examination. The grade wise details and percentage of the number of students are as follows;

3. Feedback Process

A. Internal Assessment Feedback

Students were apprised of their performance at Semester end feedback session. At this session, each student was individually guided with respect to their internal assessment score and expected external assessment scores. The first semester end feedback was held in the month of December 2017. This was done in the presence of the Principal and the mentor of the student. Thus, the students along with the faculty in charge were encouraged to frame a plan of action to improve their results.

B. Feedback Obtained from various Stake Holders

Feedback was sought from the students at the end of the semester as well as individually for some activities. The representation of student voice through feedback mechanisms, as student council body as well as representation at the IQAC and College Development Committee meetings has empowered the students as well as the leadership in its decision making process. Feedback was also obtained from various stakeholders like Parents, Community Camp centres, Practice teaching schools for the improvement in various dimensions of the institution.

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2. Expert talk and Workshop

V. Admission

1. Admission Process

The students were admitted on the basis of their CET examination score conducted by Directorate of Higher Education, Maharashtra and purely based on the norms and regulations laid by the Government. The merit list was drawn and admission granted on fulfilling the requirements of the eligibility criteria. Admission was given based on the pedagogy (subject) wise allotment of seats. Since, the college is under Christian Minority Status, 50% of the students were admitted based on the Christian minority quota. In the academic year 2017-18, 50 students were admitted in the college out of which, 4 were male students and 46 female students. The admission process was completed and approved by the Directorate of Higher Education, Pune.

VI. Student Support and Progression

1. Faith Formation Session

The Institution organized a faith formation session for minority students on 11th January 2018. Resource person shared his thoughts on different myths related to Christian faith and traditions.

2. Student Council

The institution always caters towards democratic setup by providing opportunities to the students to participate in the process of planning. The institution has the culture of setting up the student council through a democratic way. In this current academic year, the student council election was held in the month of July 2017 for S.Y Students and November 2017 for F.Y students. Student council members lead the student community to organize various activities catering to the students' needs in different ways. The council organizes various activities that are in sync with the holistic development of future teachers. Celebrations like Diwali, Navratri, Christmas Celebrations, Canteen day, One day picnic and educational excursion etc. were successfully planned and organized by the Student Council. The council also arranged indoor games, annual sports meet and executed inter house competitions at the institutional level. Student council meetings were held systematically to discuss the various issues and concerns of the students regarding campus life.

Students organised and designed the program in such a way that all the students should get equal chance to participate in the activities. All students are participated actively in all the activities.

Mentoring as an activity was focused upon right from the start of the course. Each staff member was allotted a group of students to mentor. Individual as well as group mentoring was done, based on the need of the mentoring group. In the second semester, buddy mentoring was also initiated with the second year students by the institute. In the Buddy Mentoring system, the second year student teachers acted as mentors to first year B.Ed students. The second year students shared their experiences and resources with the first year students with reference to internship program, evaluation process and co-curricular activities. Mentoring provides a platform to the students to share their difficulty with a particular faculty and get directions from them.

5. Women's Cell

In order to sensitize students towards various women related issues, the women's cell conducted various sessions during the academic year. On 8th March, 2018, a special assembly was conducted to celebrate Women's day and organized a talk on women issues and social responsibility with Byculla Police Station and MSWC.

20 students and 3 staff members attended a women empowerment talk. This was hosted by Barkha Dutt along with Ekta Kapoor and Nimrit Kaur at Taj Vivanta. Reflective discussion Forum of Students was created and feedback was taken with Qualitative Analysis.

Survey conducted on B.Ed. students on Awareness of Women Achievers, input followed by group wise charts on themes on :

6. Student Resource Sharing

Reflective and creative workshop was conducted by student leaders in two assembly slots to bring awareness and alternative ways to plastic ban in the month of March 2018 under X-LED (Xavier Leadership Efficacy Development). Students shared their talents and resources with the class throughout the year. Music band as a part of X LED celebrated the musical talents of the students. This unique initiative discovers the talents of the students as resources.

7. Theme Based Assembly

The institutional activity begins everyday with theme based assembly. Theme based assembly ends with reflections shared by faculty or students on the basis of the theme. As a new initiative, this year the institution started practicing to integrate the library activity with the assembly. In this new initiative, students were asked to read a book /an article and present their reflective view point in the assembly. This helps the faculty members and students to reflect on various educational issues in the assembly.

Campus Placement was organized on 13th January and 5th February 2018. The campus placement program was conducted in three phases as Pre interview Orientation program, campus placement and Post campus placement program. 27 Schools participated from local and international level. 45 students appeared for interviews and Feedback had taken from the Schools for quality improvement.

11. Co-Curricular Activities

Conduction of co-curricular activities has always been a matter of precision at the institute. Several activities are conducted throughout the year for student progress;

Every student was given the opportunity to showcase their potentials, be it in performing arts, fine arts or any other field of interest. Staff meetings were held monthly during the academic year to plan and execute activities of the institution. In the staff meeting, regular review and analysis of various academic programs were held, the grievances, suggestions of the staff and student are considered.
