Course Theme:

IPP was introduced about two decades before in all Jesuit institutions. It has been observed that Jesuit institutions are still orienting their teachers in IPP and how to implement it in the teaching -learning process. This course is designed to help teachers understand the paradigm and gain more understanding and confidence in implementing it. SXIE believes that IPP is a pedagogical paradigm which is applicable at all times in all contexts, thus can be applied by all teachers. Thus IPP has a universal nature, which can be experienced by course participants.

- Adopt innovative strategies to induce reflective learning
- Develop an understanding of the qualities and characteristics required for an IPP practitioner
