**Introduction:**

Mentoring is a process where an experienced and knowledgeable person guides and supports a less experienced person to help them achieve their personal and professional goals. The mentor provides guidance, advice, and support to the mentee, helping them to develop their skills and knowledge in a particular area.

The purpose of this report is to provide an overview of the implementation of a mentoring programme at St. Xavier's Institute of Education (Autonomous), Mumbai. The mentoring programme was introduced at this institution with the aim of fostering positive relationships, enhancing student well-being, and promoting academic success within the college community. This report outlines the objectives, strategies, and outcomes of the programme.

**Objectives:**

The mentoring program was designed to achieve the following objectives:

- a) Foster a supportive and inclusive school culture.
- b) Improve student engagement and motivation.
- c) Enhance academic performance and achievement.
- d) Develop students' social-emotional skills.
- e) Encourage positive peer relationships and conflict resolution.

**Roles and responsibilities:**

1. **Mentor:** The mentor is responsible for providing guidance, support, and advice to the mentee. They should be knowledgeable and experienced in the field and should be able to provide constructive feedback and help the mentee develop their skills.
2. **Mentee:** The mentee is responsible for being open to feedback, asking questions, and actively engaging in the mentoring process. They should be willing to learn and grow and should be receptive to the mentor's guidance and advice.
3. **Organisation:** The organisation is responsible for providing the necessary resources and support for the mentoring programme. This may include training for mentors and mentees, regular check-ins to ensure the programme is running smoothly, and resources to support the mentoring relationship.

Mentoring is a valuable process that can help individuals develop their skills, achieve their goals, and advance their careers. Effective mentoring requires a dedicated mentor, an engaged mentee, and the support of the organisation. While there may be challenges, the benefits of mentoring far outweigh the difficulties, making it a worthwhile investment for both individuals and organisations.

## **Programmes and Activities under Mentoring**

**Planning and Design:** Faculty coordinators and the principal in charge collaborated to plan and design the mentoring programme. They defined the programme's goals, identified target students, and developed appropriate mentoring strategies and activities.

**Mentors:** Mentors were selected from among teaching faculty members. Mentors, through effective communication techniques, and strategies, build positive relationships with mentees.

**Grouping of Mentoring:** Mentors were carefully grouped with mentees based on their shared interests, academic needs, and compatibility. The learner profile was used to get information about the mentees.

**Individual Mentoring:** Sessions between Mentor and Student o During the academic year, each student was assigned one mentor.

The mentor and mentee may engage asynchronously on various e-modes depending on the need and difficulty.

Each student receives individualised guidance to address their academic and personal issues. The mentor is there to provide direction and advice on matters of academic and social success.

Group mentoring consists of sessions involving peer mentees and the mentor.

A monthly meeting was organised and planned into the calendar.

The mentee may get support and advice from the peers in the mentoring group, which the peers can give based on their own experiences.

The group may work together to solve problems that affect the members' academic and social success.

## **Stages for Implementing the Programme**

The mentoring programme was integrated into the college's monthly schedule. Regular mentor-mentee meetings were scheduled at designated times. Mentors provided guidance, academic support, and emotional encouragement to their mentees through one-on-one interactions and in groups. On the basis of the academic calendar and the academic needs of the students, monthly themes and agenda points for mentoring sessions were planned in advance. The students and the teachers were given a copy of the agenda points as well as the theme topics for discussion for the entire semester.

### **Regular meetings with students**

- Meet and / or discuss with the individual student regularly.
- Meet all the students in the mentoring group and provide suggestions during the official mentoring session.
- Fill up the details in the log book provided by the institute based on each group or individual mentoring programme.
- The presentation of the points before the monthly staff meeting arises from the mentoring sessions.

### **Feedback**

At the end of the academic year, the standard feedback sheet was distributed to assess the effectiveness of the mentoring program. Feedback from mentees was collected to make necessary adjustments and improvements.

### **Outcomes and Benefits:**

- a) **Improved Academic Performance:** The mentoring program contributed to increased student engagement, motivation, and academic achievement.
- b) **Enhanced Social-Emotional Well-being:** Mentees experienced improved social skills, increased self-confidence, and a greater ability to manage stress and conflicts.
- c) **Positive Climate:** The presence of mentors created a sense of belonging, and mentees felt more connected to the community.

- d) Peer Relationships: The program facilitated positive peer relationships, with mentees developing strong bonds with their mentors.

The implementation of a mentoring program in St.Xavier's Institute of Education has yielded positive outcomes and benefits for the students and the school community. The program has effectively contributed to improved academic performance, enhanced social-emotional well-being, and the development of positive peer

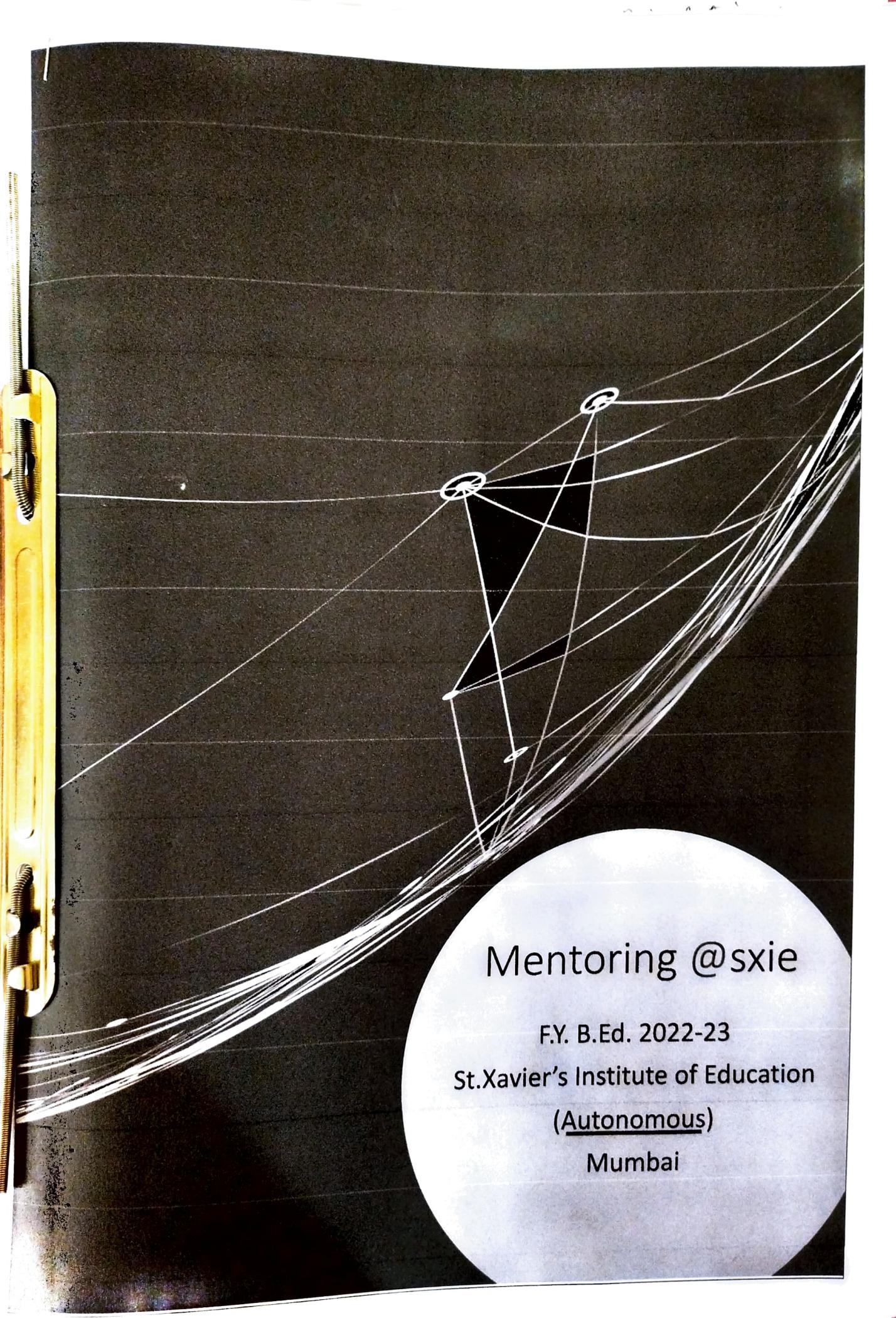

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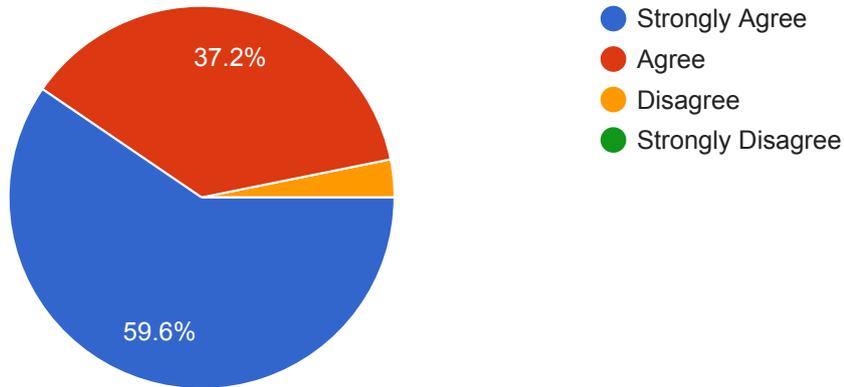

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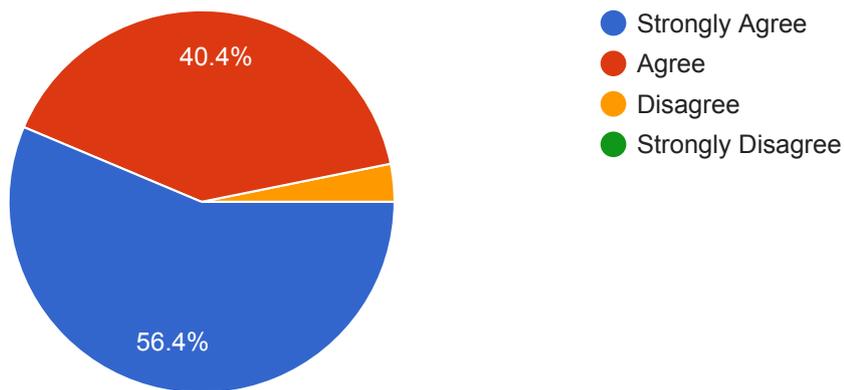

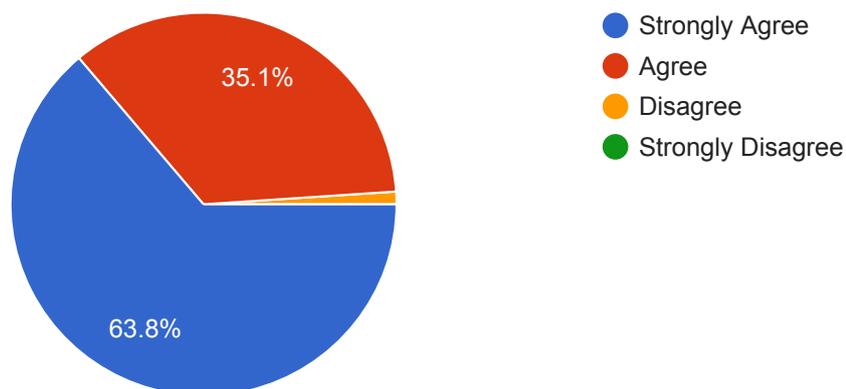

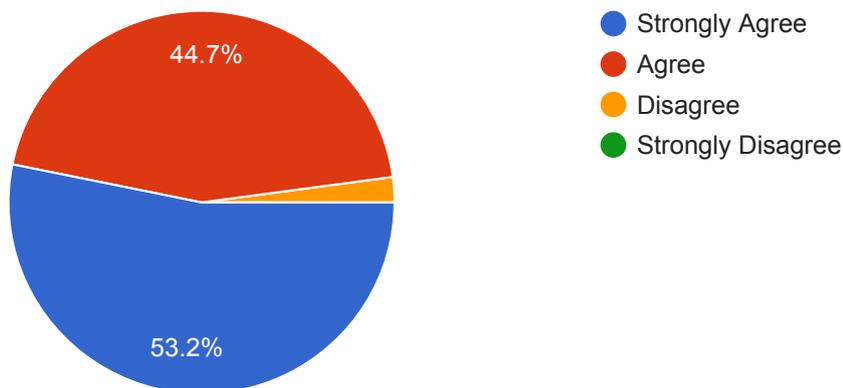
