2021-22

Initiatives and Analysis

The academic year of 2021-22 was a year of new challenges and resilience. It started with the lockdown continuing all the lectures and co-curricular activities were online. The online classes were still supplemented with student-friendly activities and slowly readjusting to back to face-to-face classes.

The Institute was also going through a transition period of moving from being an affiliated college to an autonomous college. The curriculum revisions were underway. One more important aspect was that of research journal and application for its ISSN number.

The academic as well as the support staff along with the Principal and the management made the Institute safe and ready for the students. Initially there were even some hybrid sessions conducted. The essence of teaching, learning and assessment was not compromised and even the change was swift and smooth.

The internship, community work was conducted with balance of safety and achievement of the goals. The outcomes of different curricular and co-curricular activities were assessed for their achievements, presented in the different advisory bodies for quality check and improvement. Students' voice and suggestions were integrated in every program so as to make it need based and harmonious. The assessment was still in online mode and the question paper had pattern that continued with the objective questions, but gradually the change was informed to the students to be ready for offline learning and teaching. As the lockdown norms slowly eased and opened then the challenge was to balance the academic activities on the physical settings. The precautions were taken and in midst of academic replanning of curriculum and assessment, the completion of the curriculum was done.
