Speaker's Topic -Police, Women Helpline, Child Line and how they can be approached in times of crisis

He provided lot of evidence and case studies on how the police had been dealing with the problems with girl child and women being exploited and gave helpline numbers for reference. He also motivated the future teachers how they need to be aware and be also on social media for the same .

2. Adv. Veena Gowda-

Veena Gowda is a women's rights lawyer who has been practicing in the High Court of Bombay, Family Court and other trial courts for more than two decades. A graduate of the prestigious National Law School of India University, Bangalore, she began her career in 1995 with a Mumbai-

based legal aid centre for women. By 2005, she had established an independent practice, and has since secured justice for hundreds of women in cases of domestic violence, sexual harassment in the workplace, sexual abuse, and property rights cases. She currently heads a team of lawyers working exclusively on women's legal rights. Her counsel on issues concerning violence against women is sought by various NGOs and women's rights organisations.

Speaker's Topic: Women law and safety measures for teacher by the Law

Ms. Veena spoke with reference to many incidents where law has been put in place regarding the emancipation and empowerment of women. She also gave reference to Mathura case and Vishakha case because of which new laws came into practice in the state. She did mention that in spite of these laws still how women and other gender has been taken advantage of and we need to be more aware and alert.

3. Mr. Deepak Chattopadhyay-

A member of the juvenile justice board and professor of Law at Lala college of law ,practicing advocate at Bombay high court since 10yrs

Topic of speaker: child Rights

MR. Deepak spoke on various cases that he worked for the child's rights and the steps taken by government to safeguard women and girl child's rights. He also made a mention of how security could be claimed for institutions where there are more women students or employees

Topic of speaker -Child Welfare programs and measure

Mr. Deepak gave a detailed reference and helpline numbers where children who are exploited or destitute could be send for or reported, to help them to be safe and taken care of. He brought to notice that even in exploitation it is noted that discrimination done on the grounds of gender, where boys are found mostly in the labor work and so more reported cases whereas girls are found in the domestic work and thus reported cases are less.

There was report reading done for the 2019-2020 activities that were conducted by the Women Development Cell Committee. A report on the gender audit conducted was also provided to the audience.
